During his apprenticeship in the Naples of the Princes of Aragon - collectors of the work of the Northern painters - Antonello acquired Flemish oil painting techniques: the layering of paint and glazes creates depth and subtle transitions from shade to light, while also enabling meticulous realism in physical terms and in the stroke by stroke rendering of Christ's hair and beard. It differs from more traditional versions painted during the Italian Renaissance. This portrait is one of the best among the more than ten portraits painted by Antonello. He exercised an enormous influence on Italian painting, not only by the introduction of the Flemish invention, but also by the transmission of Flemish tendencies. The bold and highly original iconographic scheme conveys the sufferings of Christ when he was grown old he at last favoured Roger of Bruges, his pupil, with the knowledge, and Roger taught .
